In Matthew 9:37-38 Jesus says to his disciples “The harvest is plentiful, but the laborers are few; therefore pray earnestly to the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest.” This is in response to the harassed and helpless crowds mentioned in v. 36. Here we see two problems Jesus identifies, and one solution he charges us to.


Problem 1: The crowds are harassed and helpless. He sees multitudes around him, hustling and bustling, all in vain. This is much like today. People are looking for satisfaction and hope in things that can’t provide them, and they wind up harassed and helpless like the crowds in v. 36

Problem 2: There aren’t enough laborers (v. 37). He identifies that there aren’t enough laborers to meet the need of the harvest. In this case there aren’t enough everyday, ordinary, disciplemakers to go and meet the needs/preach the gospel to the harassed and helpless.

Solution: Pray to the Lord to send out laborers. Jesus calls his disciples (and us), to pray for laborers to send into the harvest. Funny enough, oftentimes when we pray for laborers, God himself invites us to participate in his plan to share the gospel with the crowds. Join me in praying for laborers!

Update from the Finance Committee

God continues to bless First Baptist in so many ways. Because of your generous giving during the first quarter of 2024, we can support various ministry programs for all age groups and meet our budgeted operating expenses. This allows us to faithfully spread the Gospel of Jesus Christ to our church community.

All of this would not be possible if not for the many faithful and regular givers that give to First Baptist. The Apostle Paul in Philippians 4:14-20, talks about and thanks the people of Philippi, for their faithful giving to support his ministry. It is with that same gratitude, the leadership of First Baptist, thank you for your continued and faithful support.

Giving for the first quarter exceeded our projected giving goal as can be seen on our giving thermometer. First quarter giving was \$349,359, which exceeded our goal of \$336,821, or 30.3% of our budgeted giving for 2024. Additionally, First Baptist was able to meet all of its budgeted expenses for the quarter and showed a surplus of \$78,000 after expenses.

This generous giving has allowed the church's cash position to continue to improve. The trustees and finance committee are currently working on a plan on how best to use some of its cash reserves for future ministry needs and to potentially prepay the mortgage.





FBC Prison and Jail Ministry

Ministry to female inmates at Buffalo County Detention is such a blessing amid the hard. Currently at this writing there are 151 people incarcerated for various crimes. 83% (126) are male and 17% (25) are female. All have brokenness in their lives and need God in their lives. Joan E. Mickelsen and I co-lead a group of approximately 10 to 15 female inmates once a week in Bible study. Some of these women are surprised that we are willing to come in and give our time to minister to them. I always say, "Joan E and I are no different from you. We have had brokenness in our lives, and someone cared enough to share Jesus with us. We are one bad decision from joining you in this place. God can make all the difference in our lives, and we want you to have that same opportunity that we've had to ask Jesus for forgiveness and to come into your lives." Many of these women have children and grandchildren. By ministering to these women, we in turn can minister to their children. We have been blessed that several women have grabbed hold of our Lord and Savior, continue to hold on tight, have turned their lives around and are now serving their communities and helping others. We are thankful for the opportunity to be Christ's hands and feet, blessed to have Him working in and through us to reach those that are incarcerated. We not only bring the Gospel to these women, but we also teach accountability, helping them to find patterns in their daily living that are negatives that bring them down and patterns of positive behaviors that lift them up. By recognizing those patterns, they can focus on strengthening their strengths and positives and decreasing the negatives. We give them Scriptures to memorize, and we work with them on praying - talking with our Lord and listening to Him. We celebrate victories with them and sometimes cry with them. In August 2023 Roger Anderson invited Troy Peterson to become a part of FBC's Prison and Jail Ministry, with Troy soon learning that Roger would be retiring from the ministry after many years of leading it. Troy has taken on the challenge to lead the two men's groups. "We pick a book in the Bible and go around the room, each reading a chapter, then it's open for discussion. Talk about real-life discipleship! I can't help to think if Jesus were on earth today would we find Him in jails and prisons talking to criminals and outcasts. "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but the sinners (Mark 2:17). I was in prison and you came to visit me... I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of mine you did for me." (Matthew 25:36, 40). Throughout the Bible we are reminded that Jesus identifies strongly with the weak, the helpless, and the outcast. He considers the way we treat them to be the way we treat Him. He wants us to identify with them as well, putting ourselves in their shoes and caring for them. Since I have volunteered for the Jail Ministry my faith has grown so much it's hard to put into words. Hello First Baptist Friends! This is Ryan with the Navigators. The Navigators at UNK is a discipling ministry that exists to “Know Christ, Make Him Known, and Help Others do the Same”. We are so excited to partner with you in sharing the gospel, and discipling college students at UNK. I’d love to share with you a little bit more about who we are as a ministry, and how we hope to join you in seeing the great commission come to fruition at UNK.

Firstly, we hope to “Know Christ”. We seek to personally Know Christ in meaningful and deep ways. We don’t do “diet Jesus” but rather dig deep and solid foundations built on the Word of God, and prayer. We seek to spend daily time in the Word, pray for our needs, the needs of others, and in praise to Jesus, fellowship in community with other believers who will both encourage us, and spur us on to love and good deeds, and build patterns of sharing the gospel both with our words and actions. All of this being rooted in the gospel, and motivated by the love that Christ demonstrated to us in his life, death, and resurrection. A ministry is only as strong as the foundation it is built on, and we pray and strive to be a ministry rooted and built on Christ alone, and for the glory of Christ alone.

Secondly, we hope to “Make Christ Known”. Last words are really important, and Jesus’ last words to us were the Great Commission in Matthew 28:18-20 “Go, therefore, and make disciples of all nations”. As we personally know Christ, we, being motivated by the gospel, want to share the good news of Jesus with those around us. We seek to help students share Christ with friends in their classes, clubs, and workplaces. One example of this has been with Ben. Ben is a sophomore student at UNK. Ben, as a section leader in the marching band, met Bryce, a Freshman trombone player. Ben began to share his faith with Bryce, and invited Bryce to read the Bible with him. As the semester has progressed, Bryce has grown in his own hunger for God, has begun spending time in the Word on his own, and is now growing in his desire to help others walk with God!

Finally, we strive to “Help Others do the Same”. I often think about discipling as a chain. Each person represents one individual chain link. Jesus was the original chain link, and as he disciplined the 12, they became the second link. After Jesus left, the disciples began to add links to their chain. All of us are here, because individuals have faithfully “helped others do the same” for the last 2000 years. We are praying that students like Bryce will learn to entrust others with the gospel that was entrusted to them, ultimately keeping the chain growing.

That’s who we are. The Navigators at UNK are a team, committed to “Knowing Christ, Making Him Known, and Helping others do the Same”
