First Forum



Will a person follow God for nothing? It's a question that comes out of Job. It's Satan's first response to God. It is still a valid question to ask about our own lives.

A Study done on American youth found that although many claim to be Christian, what they really believe in is what the authors called MTD, Moralistic, Therapeutic, Deism. God exists to make me a better person and give me a better life. Otherwise, God is not involved in a person's life. While the study was on youth, the fact is that the youth will have largely seen this in their parents and that it is currently the primary religious view in the culture. It's a view that makes us consumers more than pursuers of God. And it slips in subtly, often using spiritual-sounding words.


At some point, we need to take stock and evaluate if we are becoming people who are consumers of Christ or if we are pursuers of Christ.

A consumer of Christ is a consumer of the Christian religion. They act Christian, do religious-looking things, and possibly even believe much of the faith because they think that in doing so, they will get something from God or others. A "good life," freedom from pain or want, social acceptance, a "good family," and financial security. Some even become so tied to this that they imagine that any good thing that comes to them must be evidence that God is blessing them for their goodness. However, it's likely that Satan is not opposed to using material "blessings" if it will cause spiritual destruction. Many organizations worldwide are experiencing significant material increases while being destructive to humanity and a person's walk with God. And there is the problem. We assume pleasant things are good simply because they are pleasant. It is an illogical leap. We do not evaluate whether these pleasant things are causing us to drift from God. Enjoyable is not the same as good just like pain is not the same as evil. Where we confuse these truths, we do ourselves and others deep harm, even if it does not immediately feel like it. Consumers are ultimately about themselves. Pursuing is different.

When you are in pursuit, you get rid of anything that is in the way, anything that hinders you. Pursuing something requires focus, and the thing being pursued is valuable. I'm not saying that one has to get rid of everything pleasant. But if what you pursue is of value, then whatever holds you back may be a liability. Following hard after something with your arms full of unnecessary baggage is challenging. Paul says it this way. "Let us strip off every weight that slows us down, especially the sin that so easily trips us up. And let us run with endurance the race God has set before us." (Hebrews 12:1b NLT).

Will a person follow God for nothing? Is Christ the one we pursue and follow, the one we treasure? Am I a consumer or a pursuer? These are questions that we likely must ask ourselves regularly. But Christ is worth both the question and the pursuit.

NOTES FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

As we are well into February, January 2025 is now behind us. Attached is the giving thermometer, which we use to track contributions throughout the year. FBC received \$93,798 in January, which is approximately 7.9% of our 2025 giving goal.

When preparing the 2025 budget, we projected January contributions of approximately \$125,000. However, it's important to remember that this was only an estimate based on historical giving, and monthly fluctuations in giving are standard.

FBC's overall income for January was \$95,000, while monthly expenses totaled \$116,000, resulting in a \$21,000 deficit for the month. While covering all expenses each month would be ideal, it is not always possible, and we rely on savings to make up the difference. As a congregation, your generous giving in the past has enabled us to cover monthly shortfalls.

We need to remember that the Lord is in control of everything. In 1 Chronicles 29:11-12, it says: "Everything in the heavens and on earth is yours, O Lord, and this is your kingdom. We adore you as the one who is over all things. Wealth and honor come from you alone, for you rule over everything. Power and might are in your hand, and at your discretion people are made great and given strength." (NLT)

Scripture clearly tells us that God is in control of everything, including FBC's finances. As we give, we should do so freely and sacrificially, trusting that He has the final say in how and when we receive provision. While we all desire to have control over every aspect of life, we must ultimately place our faith in God, who governs all things.




Mike and Becky Mann Missionaries in Thailand

Mike and Becky Mann are ABC Missionaries in Northern Thailand. They began service in Thailand in 1991 building clean water systems to the Lahu tribe in Northern Thailand. By 1996 they realized that all tribal groups were in need of clean water and other economic developments. That is how the Integrated Tribal Development Foundation began. Six teams were formed to build the project areas that they seek to address: clean water, education and social development, Thai Arabica coffee production, Lanna Coffee and Cafe, agriculture extension and marketing, and Hands to Heart Women's coop. Through these six areas thousands of hill tribe villagers have been reached.

Some of the names have changed recently but they are the same delicious coffees served here at our coffee bar. You can also contact Angie Gillming at 308-233-2291 as she usually has coffee on hand.

Hands to Heart Women's Cooperative was formed as a way to help women hone their craft skills and have a substantial income even though they are in remote areas. Debbie Tingley is in Thailand as a volunteer and she travels with the team to the villages to help with sewing classes, how to use natural dyes to make beautiful hand woven crafts, and how to market their crafts. They have ornaments, dolls and stuffed animals as well all made from hand woven materials.

Please register at kearneyfb.org/kids no later than Wednesday, March 12th so the leaders can purchase supplies.


