First Forum



I just finished up a course for my degree which required me to submit a weekly response to a devotional. I had thought of rewriting it for this newsletter, but all my attempts seemed to miss how this passage impacted me so below is what I originally wrote. It probably gives more of an insight into my life than what you wanted but I hope it is helpful.


In this devotional, I got stuck on the first verse that is mentioned. I think I have gotten so used to the verse that, when referring to Jesus knocking at the door, it says, "I will come in and eat with that person.". (Rev 3:20). At some point in my development, it stopped seeming odd that the God of the universe would want to spend time with me, not necessarily for the purpose of giving direction or tasks, but that He would want to spend time with me because He just wanted to hang out. To sit across the table over bread or soup. What an odd thing for the King of the Universe to want to do with any of us. What an odd thing to think of Him wanting this with me.

I know that "hanging out" seems undignified when referring to God, but I don't know what other word to use when someone knocks at the door in the hopes of just sharing a meal together, or coffee, not begging, but wanting connection.

What an undignified God; who eats with sinners, invites Himself to dinner with Zacchaeus, runs to the prodigal, and spends time with children. It seems He is more concerned with the relationship than the decorum.

For some reason, it has become normal for me to imagine that God's actions are about a task or activity. I think I have substituted the word task for the more accurate word "purpose". The idea of Him eating with me is not based on Him having an ulterior motive, as if the time and sharing were not enough, or perhaps as if I am not enough on my own, that there is something He wants from me. Even my questioning of why He would want to do this with me is misplaced. I think there must be something about me, or a task He requires, that would make Him want this. And since I cannot imagine what that would be, I cannot imagine Him doing this. But that is assuming it has to do with me. It is more likely that He does this because of His character and nature. Perhaps He offers to eat with me simply because He wants to eat with me—what a wonderfully weird thing to consider.

NOTES FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

As we move into the second quarter of 2025, we are grateful for those who faithfully give to First Baptist. In April, First Baptist received \$92,226 in giving. Combined with our first quarter giving of \$296,898, this brings our total to \$389,125 for the first four months of 2025. When looking at the attached thermometer, we are behind the goals for the first quarter. We historically have had lower giving during the Summer months, so we front-load the goals to help us make up the gap during that time. So, while we are keeping up with our expenses overall, we still want you to be aware of the needs to keep your giving consistent during this season.

First Baptist's total income from all sources for the first four months, excluding Capital Campaign contributions, was \$404,539. Operating expenses totaled \$475,508, resulting in a shortfall of \$70,969. This deficit is primarily due to \$44,000 in additional building projects, with the remainder attributed to the timing of expenses relative to income received. While this shortfall is concerning, the church currently has sufficient savings to cover the gap.


Despite the challenges, First Baptist's overall financial position remains strong. We encourage each of you to prayerfully consider how you can help ensure the church's financial health. As faithful followers of Christ, we are called to be generous, regardless of how much we have. Giving back to God's work through financial support enables the ministry of the church to continue—and it is through this generosity that we can experience great blessing.

We can be reminded of the verses in 2 Corinthians 8:1-4:

"And now, brothers and sisters, we want you to know about the grace that God has given the Macedonian churches. In the midst of a very severe trial, their overflowing joy and their extreme poverty welled up in rich generosity. For I testify that they gave as much as they were able, and even beyond their ability. Entirely on their own, they urgently pleaded with us for the privilege of sharing in this service to the Lord's people." (NIV)

Paul reminds us that even in the face of hardship and persecution, the Macedonian believers gave generously. It was not the amount that mattered, but the spirit in which they gave.

Let this serve as a reminder to us all: we have a responsibility to give as generously as we are able, to support the work of the church and to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ.


WHERE WE WILL BE

Goal: \$1 Million Mortgage Reduction

Increase monthly cash flow available to ministries.

Our current property mortgage is \$2.3 million, which is \$240,000/year in payments. By paying down our mortgage principal by \$1 million, we will save \$125,000/year in payments. This frees resources that can be used for other areas.

Goal: Chapel & Restroom Buildout

\$1 million capital project.

Create a Chapel Room to the north of Saints Hall, and expand main restrooms into the empty space left from original remodel. The Chapel will have a sliding glass panel wall opening into Saints Hall and serve as a flexible space for smaller weddings, funerals, and other events. Restrooms at the main entrance will be expanded to accommodate conferences and large events.


